

We are the only cruise company to carry out environmental and social impact studies. Before the marketing of each new route, our experts go there to study the environments we will visit and meet the people who live there.

We make every effort to take into account the cultural heritage of the areas visited. Dialogue with local communities about the planning of excursions makes it possible to choose the aspects they wish to share with guests. We encourage traditional know-how and craftsmanship and prefer to use local products and services. All our landings are subject to a rigorous protocol. This innovative approach involves a dedicated team that ensures there is no impact on the ecosystem visited.





The PONANT Foundation

By booking your cruise, you are supporting the PONANT Foundation. It was created to support projects whose objective is to contribute to the preservation of the oceans, to support the acquisition of scientific knowledge on the polar environment and to promote interactions between peoples and cultures. Today, by supporting various associations, the Foundation is contributing in particular to the construction of a school in the Bijagos archipelago; to the preservation of coral in New Caledonia; to the study of humpback whales in the southern hemisphere, and to the fight against plastic pollution in the oceans.

As such, we comply with strict rules concerning the number of guests authorised to disembark, the distance from wildlife, the training of our expedition teams, and even emergency and medical evacuation plans.

Small capacity, advanced technologies, values of excellence, rigorous health protocol: our daily labour is to offer you optimal safety combined with the luxurious comfort of our vessels.

Mid size vessels

The capacity of our ships, with 16 to 165 cabins, allows guests to sail serenely in a bubble that minimises external risks. The smaller size of our ships also allows us to get to know you and your expectations better, in order to offer you personalised and attentive service.

A modern fleet

Our fleet is one of the most modern you can find. During their construction, all our vessels are fitted with the most advanced equipment available (software-assisted navigation, engines, catalytic converters, etc.). Regular technical shutdowns are performed in order to conduct regulatory checks and to be fitted with the latest innovations.



An exclusive insurance contract

The PONANT insurance contract goes beyond the guarantees that you have, or that you think you have. It corresponds fully to the characteristics of your trip and includes guarantees for trip cancellation insurance, missed departure / return insurance, repatriation assistance, baggage insurance, holiday interruption insurance, substitution trip, passenger civil liability and travel accident.

The French flag

The French flag is considered one of the safest in the world. PONANT is the only cruise ship owner to bear it, and it's a guarantee of environmental quality, vessel safety and labour law.

The fleet is monitored by the PACA Corse Ship Safety Centre (CSN) located in Marseille, as well as by the CSN in Caen. Safety equipment is checked and approved annually by the French authorities. Each ship is ISM certified (International Safety Management), which is a very strict international regulation.

Bureau Veritas regularly certifies the entire PONANT fleet and has, in particular, validated the sanitary protocol implemented by the Company.

Our anti-Covid health protocol

From the start of the Covid-19 crisis, we have reinforced our protocol and implemented a process to reassure guests before, during and after the cruise. Rigorous and proven, it is constantly updated based on recommendations from public authorities.

Compliance with regulations

Each country determines its own regulations for access across its borders. As these regulations do change, we shall inform you of the necessary formalities to ensure you are permitted to enter all countries on your cruise schedule and to have access on board. We also comply rigorously with all local regulations to ensure we are allowed to operate.

We also take into account the protocols issued by international health authorities: the WHO, the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) and the French Ministry of Health as well as the the CLIA (Cruise Line International Association).

Your safety on board

Since the beginning of the health crisis, we have implemented best practice on board to maintain the safety of our passengers and crew members. These actions include social distancing, the wearing of masks, the disinfection of common areas and cabins, the monitoring temperatures and air exchange. In all situations, our goal is to exceed the industry standards.

As the health situation continues to evolve, we may have to adapt our onboard protocols to ensure we maintain best practices.



Increased vigilance

Due to our awareness of the global scale of the pandemic, we have introduced and put in place a health monitoring system. Our onboard medical teams are able to carry out diagnostic procedures using equipment from our onboard hospitals, including, in particular, the ability to carry out PCR tests (these tests are for diagnostic purposes only and must in no case be regarded as substitutes for the PCR tests required before the cruise begins).

The medical management team at PONANT's head office monitors the health situation on a daily basis. We are in direct contact with CCMM, France's maritime medical consultation centre, which has specialist knowledge and expertise in combatting Covid-19.





Keep your eyes open so you do not miss the exceptional and preserved fauna of these extraordinary sites where space and time take on new meaning.

In the heart of the Chilean fjords

Your ship will chart a course towards the South of Chile, to meandering fjords where majestic glaciers seem to meet the ocean... This remote setting is remarkable for the splendour of its sea scattered with islands, and its slow and powerful glaciers that have been transforming and reshaping the landscapes over centuries. Your ship will glide over the calm waters of the fjords to edge closer to these towering walls of ice. The Agostini, Brüggen and El Brujo glaciers particularly stand out. These living giants crack, rumble and suddenly calve chunks of ice in iridescent colours. This is a real treat for photographers. During some stopovers, you will have opportunities to set out aboard our zodiac inflatables to get as close as possible to this untamed natural world, where the presence of human beings is almost imperceptible.

Fascinating South Georgia

Aboard your ship, discover South Georgia, a region formed by an underwater mountain chain that extends from the Andes to the Antarctic Peninsula. All the wildlife of the Far South can be found here: king and gentoo penguins, elephant seals and fur seals mingle on the beautiful dark sand beaches... At sea. orcas. humpback whales and other cetaceans will escort you along your navigation. You might get the chance to discover the majestic glaciers of Gold Harbour and the vast plains of Fortuna Bay. If you are fortunate enough to land at St. Andrews Bay, you can expect a wonderful spectacle: more than 300,000 king penguins, which you will recognise by the bright orange mark on their head and neck, have taken up residence there. Whatever your itinerary, South Georgia will offer you beautiful panoramas and surprising encounters, rich in emotions.

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Must-see destinations



The Ross Sea, at the edge of the world

"The last ocean" is what scientists from all around the world call this deep bay that runs along the edge of Antarctica between Marie Byrd Land and Victoria Land. Since 2016, the world's largest protected marine area has been keeping this last marine ecosystem intact. The theatre of the most impressive expeditions, it was discovered by James Clark Ross between 1839 and 1843. It was then that he discovered the enormous ice barrier formed by a gigantic ice shelf extending out to the open sea and from which titanic icebergs are calved. One third of the world's Adélie penguin population lives in the area where this frozen barrier breaks into icebergs. The currents maintain polynyas there - vast areas of persistent open water surrounded by sea ice, which give the penguins access to food. You may also get the chance to spot Ross seals, one of the rarest protected species in the Antarctic.

Splendid Pie XI Glacier

In southern Chile, on the coasts of legendary Patagonia, you will be astonished and moved by the gigantic, almost surreal, dimensions of the Pio XI glacier, also known as the Brüggen Glacier. With a surface area exceeding 1,200 km², it is the largest of the glaciers making up the Southern Patagonian Ice Field. Its majestic ice cap, the third largest in the world, straddles the southern Andes Mountains and offers breathtaking natural scenery that gives full meaning to the words 'contemplation' and 'wonder'. Pio XI never stops growing – unlike many of its fellow glaciers – providing an unforgettable and unmissable experience.

Mythical crossing of the Drake Passage

If there is one place, one sea, one waterway dreaded by tourists, researchers and hardened seafarers alike, it is undoubtedly Drake Passage. Situated at the latitude of the infamous Furious Fifties winds, between Cape Horn and the South Shetland Islands, it is the shortest route to connect Antarctica to South America. Seasoned navigators will tell you that you must earn your visit to the White Continent! At the Antarctic convergence zone where cold currents rising up from the South Pole meet warmer equatorial water masses, Drake Passage harbours a very diverse marine fauna. Don't forget to look to the sky to catch a glimpse of elegant albatross and Cape petrels, playfully floating about in the wind around your ship.











Composed of five small archipelagos and situated in the Southern Ocean between the Antarctic and Subtropical Convergences, New Zealand's sub-Antarctic islands will reveal their strange and primitive beauty to you. These volcanic islands are renowned for their surprisingly rich biodiversity, which has earned them their place as UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Comprised of Campbell Island, reputed for its fascinating megaherbs; the Antipodes Islands inhabited by albatross; the Snares Islands, one of New Zealand's last preserved regions; the Auckland Islands and Macquarie Island, these archipelagos will delight enthusiasts of unspoiled nature.

The dreamlike landscapes of the Falkland Islands

Surrounded by a grey and often wild sea, these islands are a small country of moors and rugged coastlines carved by the South Atlantic. The flora and fauna that live in these cool and humid places create a link between Patagonia and the Antarctic. Take the time to observe and photograph the different animal species. Perhaps you will have the opportunity to admire impressive sea lions basking on the water front or spot magnificent black-browed albatross come to sit on their nests. Or you may even come across southern rockhopper penguins living up to their name.



Mysterious South Shetland Islands

On the edge of the Antarctic Peninsula, 120 km from the White Continent, the South Shetland Islands offer surreal and mysterious scenery. On these volcanic islands of dark rock, the landscapes alternate between long, jagged, snow-covered coasts and large, gently sloping bays. These lunar and wild lands are home to important scientific research stations and a large number of animal species: chinstrap penguins, crabeater seals and Weddell seals, Antarctic terns, giant petrels and elephant seals have taken up residence here.



Strait of Magellan, on the road of legends

This mythical strait situated in the South of Chile and separating South America from Tierra del Fuego, awakens our imagination, stirring up a longing for adventure. Follow in the footsteps of the famous Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan, known for having organised the first circumnavigation of the globe, in the 16th century. Aboard your ship, cruise along the 600 km separating the Atlantic Ocean from the Pacific, observe the tides and the currents, and discover the many wild birds such as oystercatchers and steamer ducks that populate this remarkable zone.

An emblematic fauna

Not only does the Antarctic Peninsula, with its chain of icecovered peaks plunging down into the Drake Passage, boast the most spectacular landscapes in all the White Continent, but its coastlines are also home to the largest penguin populations. These funny-looking seabirds are emblematic of this icy region and each has different characteristics. They can literally "fly on water" when looking for food. During your zodiac inflatables outings, observe these unusual animals as they waddle clumsily along the beaches to reach their nests or their young. Being particularly peaceful and curious by nature, the gentoo, Adélie and chinstrap penguins will not shy away from your camera lens, but will always keep a safe distance. The waters here, particularly rich in nutriments, also encourage the presence of many seals, sea lions, whales and orcas. Unafraid because of an almost total absence of human presence, these animals will offer you instances of pure wonderment.

New Island, a wild paradise

The distant Balleny Islands

The Balleny Islands are an extremely remote series of islands extending for about 160 kms in a northwest–southeast direction straddling the Antarctic Circle some 270 kms north of the Antarctic mainland. The volcanic islands are heavily glaciated and have received few human visitors since their discovery in 1839. Their isolated location within the rich waters of the Southern Ocean has resulted in a species diversity rivalling the entire Ross Sea region. Humpback, fin and minke whales are regular visitors to the rich feeding grounds along with crabeater, Weddell, elephant and leopard seals. Several of the islands are home to significant colonies of Adélie and chinstrap penguins. If time and weather permit, guests will have the opportunity to explore the spectacular coastal environments and view the prolific wildlife from our fleet of zodiac inflatables.





Wild and enchanting Macquarie Island

Long celebrated as one of the wonder spots of the world, the Macquarie Island Nature Reserve lies 1,500 km south-southeast of Tasmania, halfway between Australia and Antarctica. It is an island of great beauty and outstanding natural diversity, a breeding place for many of the Southern Ocean's birds and animals. The avian statistics are remarkable; around 3.5 million seabirds arrive on Macquarie Island each year to breed and moult. This includes an estimated 850,000 royal penguins, 100,000 breeding pairs of king penguins and over 5,000 breeding pairs of gentoo penguins. In addition, four species of fur seals and the southern elephant seal come ashore to breed and moult every year.



As for the third, it is one of the planet's rare terra nullius – a territory claimed by no State – whose remoteness and climate have certainly kept it well away from human conquests. You have reached the lands of the kingdom of wilderness, a world where nature has raised its own cathedrals of ice, which offers itself to you but keeps its own secrets...

Despite the White Continent's extreme temperatures, which can drop to -90°C, and its winds exceed 200 km/h, this fascinating bird has chosen it as home. So your only choice, if you want to see it, is to go to Antarctica. Its four layers of scale-like feathers, its thick layer of fat, its unique circulatory system, which enables it to minimise heat transfer, and other special anatomical features make it the only animal in the world capable of living in such an environment. An encounter with these penguins promises intense emotions.



Vibrant Santo Domingo


Located on the south coast of the island of Hispaniola, the capital of the Dominican Republic, Santo Domingo, is also the oldest town in the Caribbean and the New World. Officially founded in the late 15th century by the younger brother of Christopher Columbus, and named after Saint Dominic, the founder of the Dominican order, the city boasts an immense historical heritage. At the heart of the old colonial town surrounded by walls and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, you will be able to admire the oldest Spanish constructions in the Americas. As you wander through the city streets, do not miss the imposing Cathedral of Santa Maria and the Alcázar de Colón, once a fortified Spanish palace. Here, the Caribean city's charm exudes from the narrow streets lined with colourful houses, dotted with bougainvilleas and punctuated with monasteries and numerous churches.

Multicultural Belize City

Belize City is the former capital and the country's largest town. Located on the Caribbean Sea, this lively town symbolises the fusion of British, Spanish and Maya cultures. The departure point for flights over the Great Blue Hole and the barrier reef, it's also the ideal gateway for discovering the treasures of Mayan architecture: in the heart of the jungle, the grandiose and mysterious ruins of temples and palaces at the Lamanai and Xunantunich archeological sites await you. Another unmissable experience: a trip to the mouth of the Belize River where with a little luck and care, you will get a glimpse of manatees, dolphins, crocodiles, iguanas and many aquatic bird species.

Idyllic Saint Barthelemy

Lovers of this island call it St. Barts. This French island in the Lesser Antilles was discovered by Christopher Columbus in 1493. Ever since, this tiny mountainous volcanic gem with its unspoilt nature has been enchanting visitors. Although, as you saunter through the streets of Gustavia or Saint Jean, you will come across jewellers, top fashion boutiques and fine restaurants, there is also a simplicity that money can't buy... From Gustavia, you can walk to Shell Beach, a lovely sheltered beach covered in small shells.













The French Caribbean and Les Saintes Bay

Made up of nine small islets and discovered by Christopher Columbus, Les Saintes awaken the imagination of travellers and offer extraordinary panoramas. Proudly ranked as the third most beautiful bay in the world, Les Saintes Bay, which formerly atrracted pirates and privateers, is now a highly desirable anchorage. During your stopover here, do not miss the chance to discover the richness and diversity of the underwater world in these crystal-clear waters during unforgettable dives, and let your gaze wander to the horizon, guided by the entertaining ballet of the saintoises, the small and colourful local fishing boats.

Progreso, a historical port of call

On the Yucatán Peninsula, the charming seaside town of Progreso will delight visitors seeking authenticity. In addition to its magnificent sandy beaches and pleasant seafront promenade, the town offers ideal access to the former Mayan cities of Chichén Itzá and Uxmal. UNESCO World Heritage sites, they allow visitors to be truly immersed in Pre-Columbian Mexico, discovering one of the world's most mysterious civilisations. Be sure to visit Mérida, capital of the Mexican state of Yucatán. Called "the White City" due to the colour of the limestone used to build its dwellings, this old colonial city, built on the ruins of a Mayan site, offers a mix of tradition and modernity, colonial architecture and Mayan heritage.

Wild landscapes from Saint Lucia

A jewel of the Caribbean with picture-postcard settings, this small island offers visitors a luxuriant and wild natural environment. Long fine-sand beaches, crystal-clear waters, hidden waterfalls, not to mention its two rocky peaks listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites are some of the natural wonders that make the island of Saint Lucia so beautiful. But its famous Soufrière is without a doubt what distinguishes it from its Caribbean sisters. Here, the thick mantle of greenery of the rainforest give way to a lunar landscape with the smell of sulphur, while the fumaroles shooting out of the ground provide proof that this imposing volcano is still very active.

Mythical crossing of the Panama Canal

Aboard your ship, experience something unique that has inspired the imagination of numerous adventurers in the 20th century: sailing the Panama Canal. Its construction started in 1880 under the direction of Ferdinand De Lesseps. Abandoned then resumed, this marvel of engineering was completed by the United States in 1887 and opened in 1914. The canal crosses the Isthmus of Panama and links the Atlantic to the Pacific. It includes three levels of locks and by raising ships to the level of Lake Gatun, almost as if the water was a lift, it allows them to avoid having to round Cape Horn.

You will grasp their greatness from the air and thus, you may be able to answer the question: how and why were they drawn so many centuries ago?



Must-see destinations



The delicate fragrance of Madagascar

The island of Madagascar became detached from the continent 240 million years ago. Its geographic isolation explains the presence of a high number of endemic species. It is home to nearly a thousand different orchids and a large number of lemurs – small, sociable primates that enliven the forest with their calls as they leap from tree to tree. With its landscapes backdropped by baobabs and ochre earth, this island continent will take you on a timeless journey into the heart of vibrant nature. The southern part of the island, your port of call, boasts veritable natural treasures, where land and sea weave together. From the island of Nosy Komba, amidst the fragile yet elegant sailing pirogues, the scents of vanilla and ylang-ylang will accompany you as you explore the island. Further out at sea await turquoise waters, magnificent coral reefs and the natural pools of Nosy Ve. This idyllic islet bordered with white sand shelters a large colony of tropicbirds, one of the species synonymous with the island.

La Digue, the pearl of the Seychelles

La Digue Island is a veritable concentration of all the beauty of the Seychelles. Located 6 km south-east of Praslin, this small piece of land that looks like paradise is the third-largest island in the Seychelles, despite its modest size. It's a paradisiacal environment of verdant nature where the iconic giant tortoises live peacefully. Its beaches of fine sand fringed with coconut trees and surrounded by emblematic granite rocks with pink highlights – like at the famous Anse Source d'Argent – invite you to escape and to dream. Authentic and preserved, the island follows a peaceful rhythm and the only means of transport along its little roads are bikes or traditional oxcarts.

Côn Dao Islands, symbols of independence

To the south of Vietnam, the archipelago of the Côn Dao Islands is composed of 16 rocks covered in flourishing vegetation. A regular stopover on the Silk Road, between the 2nd and 13th centuries, the islands were mentioned by Marco Polo during his voyage from China to India in 1294. A former English and French trading post, the archipelago became a French colony in 1861 using the name Poulo Condor. A penitentiary centre was built there and used to imprison opponents of the colonial regime. During the Vietnam War, the Saigon regime and the United States locked up communist enemies there until 1975. In its idyllic natural setting, Côn Dao has become a memorial site and a symbol of the fight for independence.













The Belitung Archipelago, reminiscent of the Seychelles

Like confetti sprinkled on the China sea, the Belitung Islands invite discovery and contemplation. Nestled to the east of Sumatra, the archipelago is composed of myriad small, idyllic islands, the largest of which are Belitung and Bangka. The archipelago generates as much wonder as it does passion. Cruising in its turquoise waters, you will be able to see the mythical lighthouse, built over a century ago and surrounded by greenery. With its shallow waters sheltering numerous species of coral and colourful fish, and its granite rocks skimming the water, Belitung is reminiscent of the Seychelles and visitors will feel as if time is standing still.

The Aldabra Atoll, a haven for tortoises

Located in the very heart of this faraway archipelago, the Aldabra Atoll is considered to be one of the last virtually untouched sanctuaries on earth, and a large population of Aldabra giant tortoises has found refuge there. Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, this vast tract of land is formed by four small coral reef islands separated by narrow passes and enclosing an emeraldwater lagoon lined with mangrove and fine-sand beaches. Aboard your ship, approach these shores with their glistening pure waters and allow yourself to be charmed by this natural marvel, believed to be one of the largest atolls in the world.

Abu Dhabi, at the gates of the desert

The capital of the United Arab Emirates, Abu Dhabi stands out thanks to its exceptional cultural offering. The Louvre Abu Dhabi – designed by Jean Nouvel as a museum town inspired by traditional Arab architecture – creates a dialogue between objects and works from civilisations all over the world around the great universal questions. A little further, the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque boasts a sumptuous decor of marble, gold and glass. Abu Dhabi is also the gateway to the Al Ain oasis and its 150,000 date palms, a remarkable testimony to the settling of nomads in the region since Neolithic times, and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Cochin, jewel of the Malabar Coast

An important port in the South-West of India, Cochin (Kochi) is one of the most beautiful cities on the Malabar Coast where the scent of cardamom mingles with cloves. It was here that Vasco de Gama disembarked over 500 years ago. But how many Phoenicians, Greeks, Arabs and Romans dropped anchor before him in the turquoise waters of the Arabian Sea? At a time when pepper from Malabar was almost as precious as gold, so many nations left these shores laden with precious spices. Today, the city, a metropolis with multiple identities, has a rich cultural and natural heritage combining former colonial residences, ancestral fishing methods and charming landscapes in the backwaters.

Visas: Before departure, please check carefully that your visas are valid for the right date and time spent in the countries in order to avoid unpleasant situations.

Warning about the use of drones: The use of drones aboard PONANT ships, whether they are sailing at sea, at a port of call or anchored, is strictly forbidden. The use of drones on land in the Arctic and Antarctic regions is also strictly forbidden by international polar regulations. In other regions, it may be possible to use drones on land if permission has been obtained from the relevant authorities of each country and each region travelled through, as well as a pilot's licence that should be obtained from your home country. Passengers are responsible for obtaining these permits; they should

- Complimentary polar parka: For all cruises marked with the logo «parka gift», a PONANT polar water-resistant parka is offered (adult sizes only - in case of consecutive cruises, only one parka per person).
- Complimentary boots hire: Boot rental will be offered onboard (for adults only) on Expedition cruises where the logo "Free Boot Rental" appears.

In addition, it is mandatory to return the medical questionnaire, provided at time of booking, between 90 and 45 days before departure. This questionnaire is very important in order to respect mandatory safety rules in polar zones. Any false information on this questionnaire may lead prior departure to a refusal of your embarkation at the port of departure, without any possible recourse.

Le Commandant Charcot: please note that for polar plunge and ice floating, an EKG (electrocardiogram) by your general practitioner in addition to the PONANT medical questionnaire will be required.

For all ships during polar expedition: also, for persons under 18 wishing to take part in these activities as well as kayaking, a sworn statement from the parents or legal guardians that they are able to swim will be asked. A parent or legal guardian must be present at the time of the activity.





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
